# MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

## MAJOR GROWTH IN DISTRICT PARTNERSHIPS

Executed nine new Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) with school districts and partner organizations, extending program partnerships through 2027. These agreements reflect a strategic shift from one-time presentations to sustained, year-round collaboration. This approach strengthens long-term relationships, increases program consistency, and ensures students have continuous access to safety resources and support systems.



## ADVANCING PUBLIC SAFETY AT THE STATE LEVEL

Hosted Texas Governor Greg Abbott signed a major bail reform package at Crime Stoppers of Houston, marking a significant public safety achievement. The legislation SB 9, SB 40, and SJR 5 aims to limit the release of violent and repeat offenders and strengthen accountability within the justice system.

## TRANSFORMING COMMUNITY ACCESS TO CRIME DATA

Successfully launched the brand new GGRC Website to partners and community members. This event highlighted the new website features including new dashboards, improved data accessibility and a fresh approach to sharing crime insights with the community.

## EXPANDING ACCESS THROUGH SPANISH-LANGUAGE PROGRAMMING

Launched The Balanced Voice en Español, a fully translated and culturally adapted version of the podcast to reach Spanish-speaking communities.



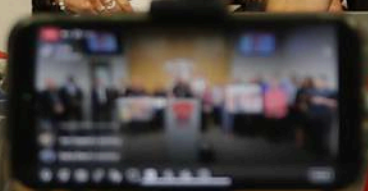
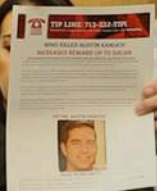
## EQUIPPING TEENS FOR TODAY'S MOST CRITICAL SAFETY CHALLENGES

Developed two new teen-focused presentations—More Than Yes: Consent Awareness and The Rise in Technology: AI Awareness—expanding educational offerings to address emerging trends and student needs. These presentations were created in direct response to requests from school counselors and increasing concerns observed in schools.

## THE JOHN M. O'QUINN FOUNDATION 'MILLION FOR MILLION' INITIATIVE

In January 2025, Crime Stoppers of Houston launched the yearlong Million for Million Initiative - an ambitious effort to equip one million students and families across Texas with critical safety resources at the cost of just \$1 per child.

Through strategic partnerships and innovative programming, we not only met our goal, but surpassed it, reaching over one million students and families. This milestone demonstrated that scalable, high-impact safety is possible when community investment, efficiency, and mission-driven leadership align.

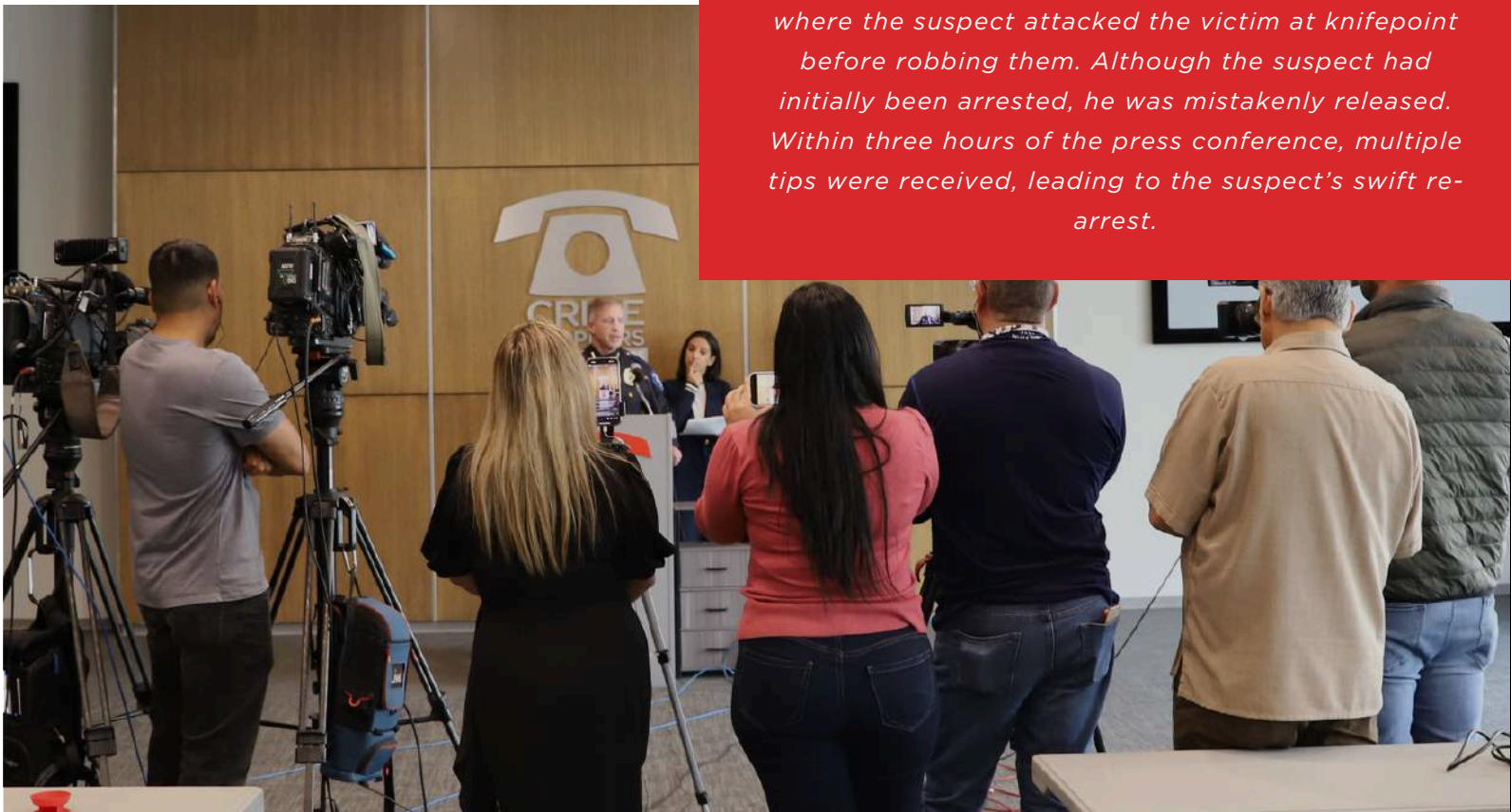

## UNIVERSITY SEXUAL ASSAULT SUSPECT ARRESTED WITHIN HOURS:

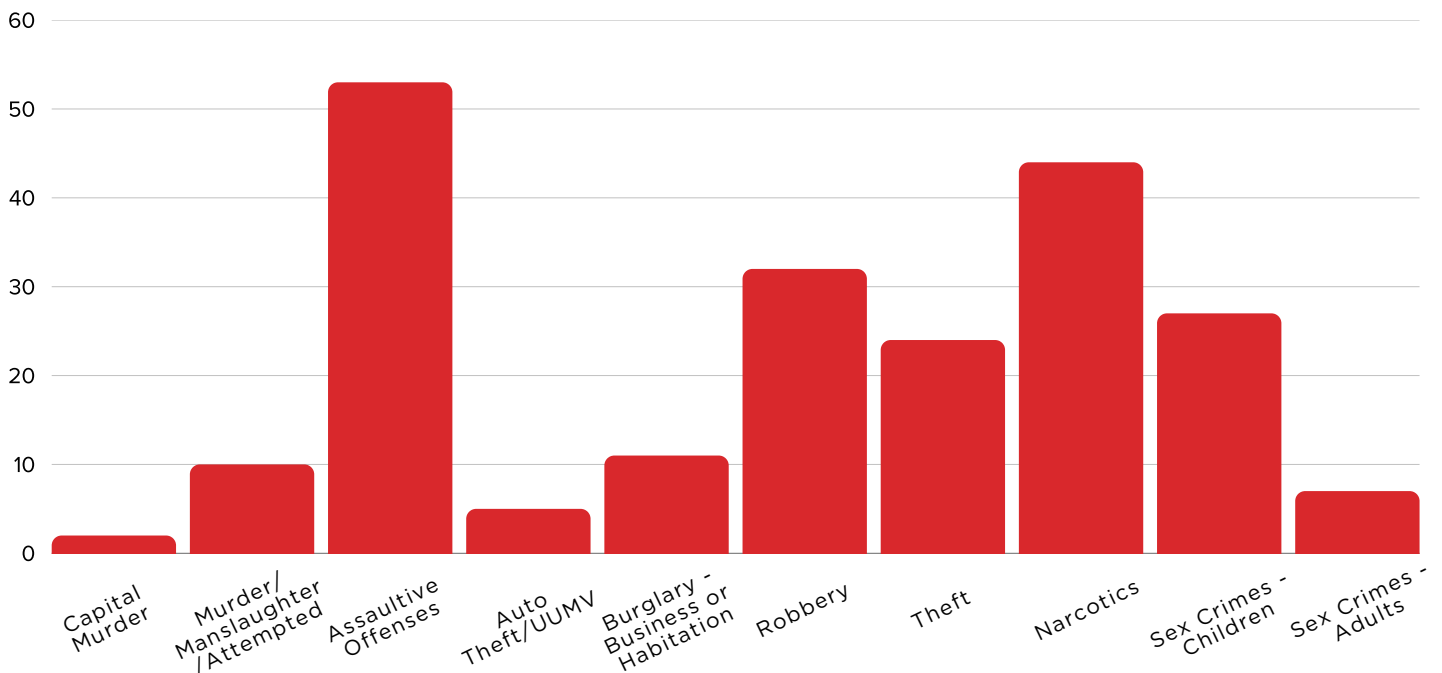
*On February 18, 2025, a press conference was held requesting the public's assistance in locating a suspect wanted for aggravated sexual assault. The assault occurred inside a university parking garage, where the suspect attacked the victim at knifepoint before robbing them. Although the suspect had initially been arrested, he was mistakenly released. Within three hours of the press conference, multiple tips were received, leading to the suspect's swift re-arrest.*



## HOW IT WORKS

- Crime Stoppers will NEVER ask you for your name, phone number, address, or any other information that could identify you.
- We do not record phone calls or have Caller Id. No one will know you called us unless you tell them.
- Once you give us your tip, you will be given a code number. This is the only way Crime Stoppers can identify you.
- You need to remember this number and provide it when you call back to check the status of your tip.
- CRIME STOPPERS CANNOT CALL YOU with the status because we don't ask for your phone number.
- When you call back with your code number we will let you know if your tip helped law enforcement arrest or charge a felony suspect/fugitive. If it did, we will give you instructions to go to a specific bank on a certain date to pick up your cash reward. You will not be asked to show any id and the money you get does not have to be reported to anyone.
- Crime Stoppers may pay cash rewards of up to \$5,000 on serious crime in the Greater Houston Area.
- The only requirement is you must report your tip directly to the Crime Stoppers Tip Line.

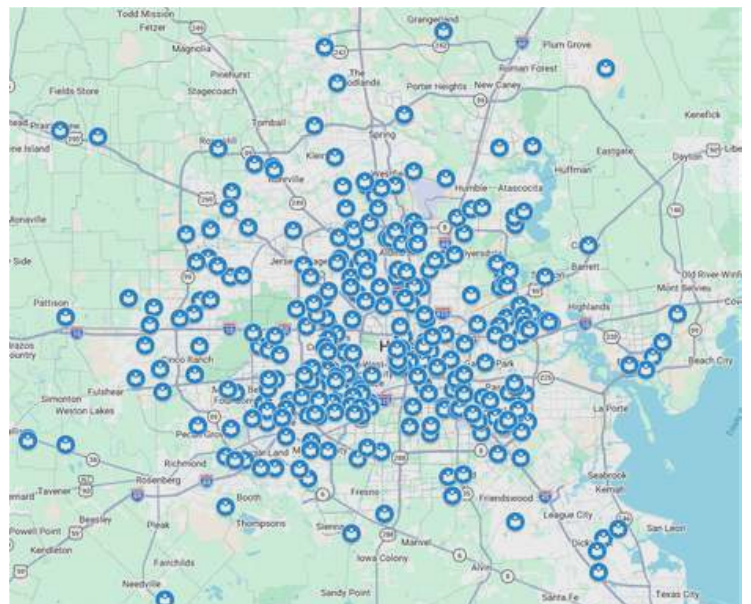
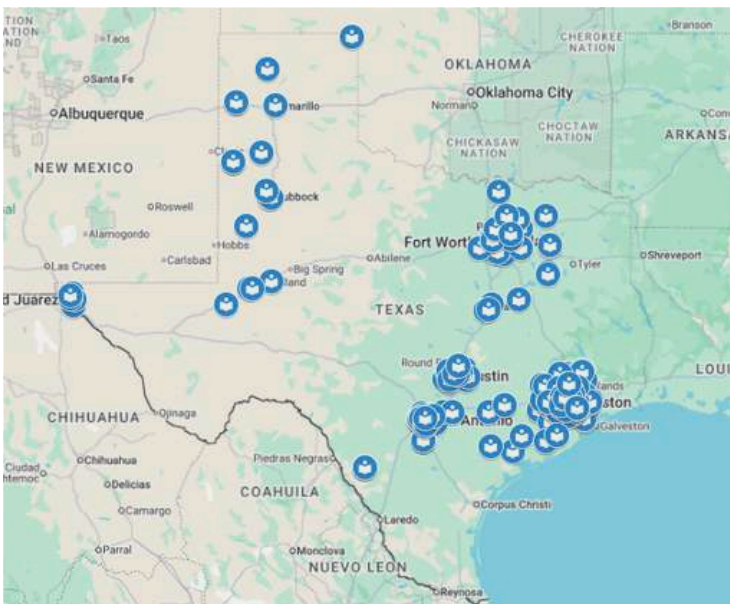


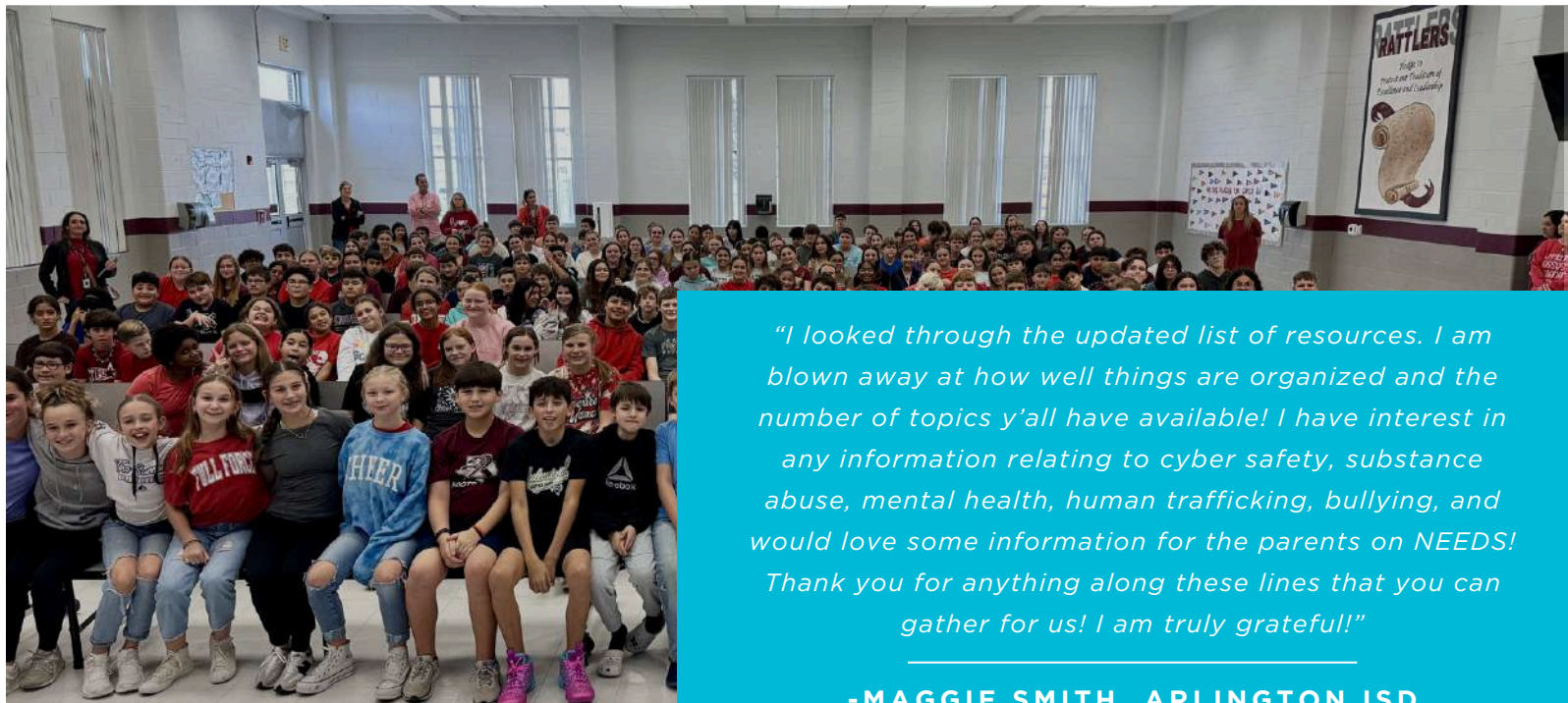
# INSTITUTE OFFERINGS

**Free Presentations:** Safety presentations are available to students, parents, school staff and school-based law enforcement in Harris County and across the State. We are committed to reaching our audience whenever they are able, whether it be during school hours or outside of school hours, on campus or off-campus. Whatever their needs are, the Safe School Institute is available at no cost to provide a customized format that addresses those needs.

**Statewide Trainings:** In response to the Santa Fe High School shooting in 2018, Governor Greg Abbott asked us to roll our Safe School Program to as many Crime Stoppers organizations across the state as possible - reaching approximately 1,800 school districts.

**S.A.V.E Webinars:** In partnership with the Texas Education Agency (TEA), we created S.A.V.E (Safety Awareness. Valuable Education.) series to provide resources for teachers, school staff, and school-based law enforcement.

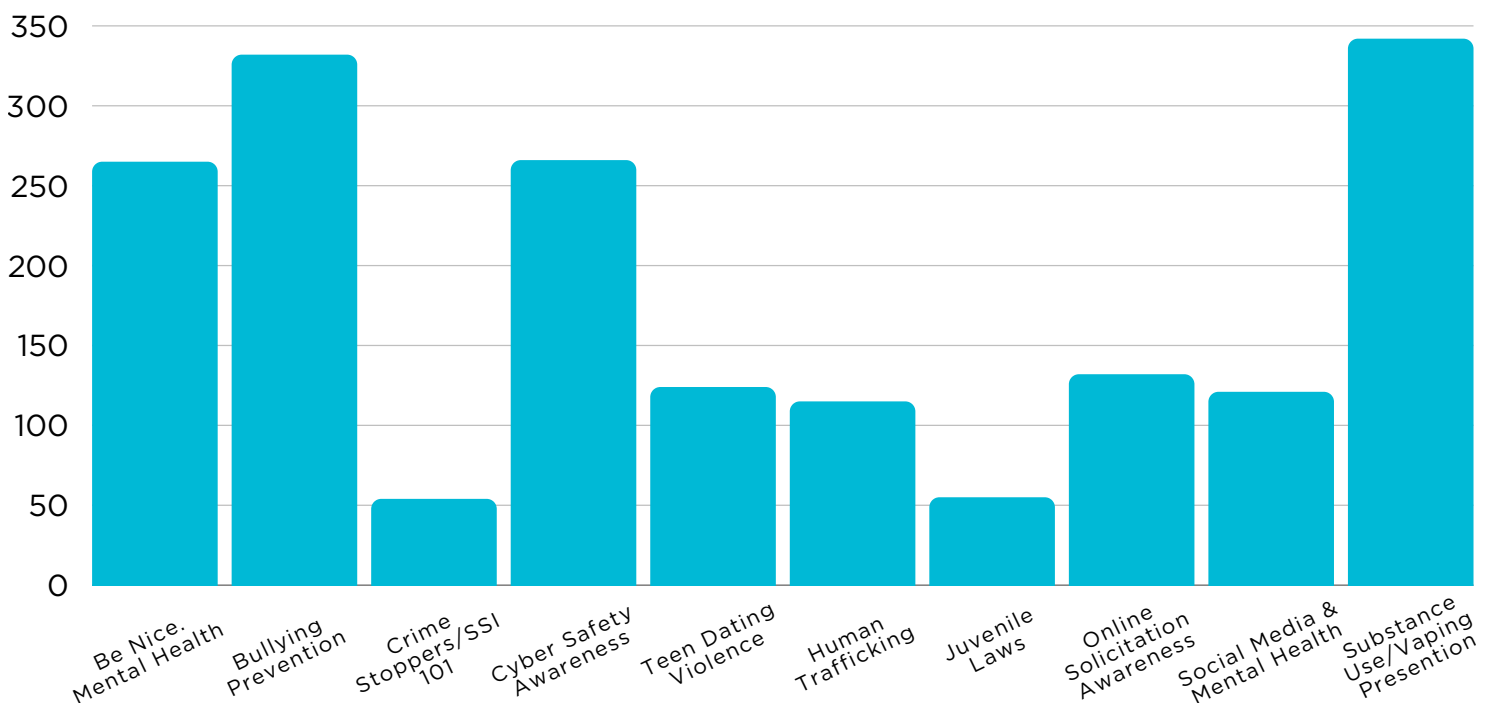

## SAFE COMMUNITY PROGRAM

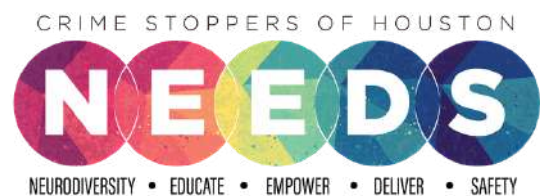
The Safe Community Program (SCP) takes profound steps to prevent future crime through citizen empowerment and education. The program educates community members, parents, and law enforcement on critical public safety concerns through free presentations, training, community events, and multi-media resources.

**Presentations:** Our team presents cutting edge information about the most critical crime trends and issues facing our community today. These presentations equip all community members with not only knowledge about these critical issues but also action steps to aid in building safe, happy, and healthy communities around them.

**Outreach Events:** The Safe Community Program connects with the public through community-based engagements designed to meet residents where they are. Staff host tables to share safety resources, answer questions, and link residents to services, while offering classes that build practical safety skills.

**Volunteer Opportunities:** Volunteers play a vital role in advancing Crime Stoppers of Houston's Safe Community Programming. From assembling child ID kits to supporting backpack distributions, they help deliver critical resources to residents while strengthening community trust and engagement in crime prevention.

**NEEDS Program (Neurodiversity, Educate, Empower, Deliver, Safety):** The Crime Stoppers NEEDS Program's mission is to champion the safety, well-being, and empowerment of the special needs community by proactively fostering knowledge of risks and safety solutions for individuals and those who live and serve them with the intention of preventing crimes against this vulnerable population.



## VICTIM SERVICES & ADVOCACY PROGRAM

The mission of Crime Stoppers of Houston’s Victim Services and Advocacy Program is to promote safety, healing, justice and rights for crime victims and survivors.

The Victim Services and Advocacy Program provides the following:

- Advocate for crime victims through all stages of victimization.
- Assist crime victims and survivors in efforts to rebuild their lives.
- Assist in collaboration between law enforcement agencies, prosecutors, probation and parole departments, juvenile justice systems and social services.
- Accompany crime victims and survivors to Court and Parole Board hearings.
- Guide crime victims and survivors through media inquiries and speaking engagements.
- Refer crime victims and survivors to local, statewide, and national victim assistance organizations.
- Work toward legislative improvements to enhance victims’ rights and public safety.

**Crime Map:** Explore crime data in Houston with our interactive map. Visualize patterns, identify hotspots, and stay informed about local safety trends.

**Houston Crime Dashboard:** Presents cutting edge information about the most critical crime trends and issues facing our community today.
